### Message from Mrs Money

As quickly as we reached Covid outbreak status, we have again moved out of it this week. This threshold is met once a certain number of cases have been reported within one group of children or staff within a certain number of days. This then means that a different set of guidance must be followed which includes parents on site, assemblies, playtimes etc. For this week the number of new cases has almost ground to a halt and we can once again resume all of the normal things in school which are so important to children, parents and staff alike. Despite this we continue to be vigilant in school as we have become accustomed to the situation changing so guickly. We have also noticed an increase in the number of children testing positive for Covid for the second time. With this in mind staff continue to test twice weekly or every day if they are considered close contacts. It also goes without saying that hand washing and sanitising remains the same.

As you are aware masks are no longer mandatory in communal spaces in schools however some staff may choose to continue to wear them. Similarly regarding wearing masks at school pick up/drop offs. Some parents may also choose to continue to wear masks. In both cases this is personal choice and since we do not always know peoples own or family vulnerabilities...please continue to be kind. It continues to be a priority to also keep staff safe as without my staff the children cannot be taught...so please bear this in mind when making your own choices about masks, social distancing and testing. But most importantly be kind, particularly on group chats and social media. Thank you for your continued support.

In the afternoon, we used our scientific skills to design, build and test a boat to help The Gingerbread Man cross the river!












