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### **Code of Conduct for Parents**

#### Introduction

We believe in creating a whole school culture that is safe and inclusive. Our aims underpin this and our code of conduct sets out key principles for creating this culture.

#### Purpose and Principles

#### The code of conduct is designed to:

- Give clear guidance on the expectations of conduct
- Create and maintain a positive ethos of mutual respect, openness and fairness
- Ensure that our children are given good role models at all times whilst in the school environment

#### The school expects all parents to respect the caring ethos of the school by:

- Understanding that parents and teachers should work together for the benefit of the children.
- Demonstrating in their own behaviour that all members of the school community should be treated with respect.
- Seeking to clarify a child's version of events with the school's view in order to bring about a peaceful solution to any issue.
- Modelling and using appropriate language with and in front of children.
- Avoiding use of inappropriate or offensive language at all times.
- Correcting their child's behaviour especially when it could lead to conflict.
- Approaching school staff to help to resolve issues.
- Avoiding using staff as threats to admonish children's behaviour.

#### All parents must exercise caution when using information technology and ensure that they do not:

- Send abusive or threatening emails.
- Use social media e.g. Facebook to write in a detrimental manner about school or any of the pupils/parents/staff of the school.
- Post on social media any photographs of school activities with pictures of other children in them.
- Use social media to discuss any issues you may have with school remember we are always available to discuss issues face to face.

#### All parents are asked to:

- Support their child with completing home learning so they start to develop good attitudes to learning at home as well as at school.
- Ensure that their child attends school regularly and inform the school immediately with the reason for their child's absence.
- Ensure that their child arrives to school on time and is dressed in the appropriate school uniform and with their book bag.
- Inform school staff about anything that may affect their child's learning and well-being at school.
- Establish good communication with school staff and support the Behaviour Policy.
- Encourage independence and self-discipline in their children.
- Encourage respect and good behaviour and make their child aware of inappropriate behaviour.
- Work with school staff to address and review any behavioural issues with their child.
- Be prompt with any payments and ensure that they speak to the school early if they have difficulties with payments.
- Read, support and sign The Home School Agreement.
- Refrain from smoking on the school premises or surrounding area.
- Use the area set aside for dogs to be contained and on a lead.
- Be considerate when parking around the school.
