I hope that you all had a relaxing half term break and managed to get outside despite the rainy weather. This week it really feels like Spring has sprung and that new beginnings are on the way. If you have any concerns about how you or your child is going to manage this return to school please contact me, the school office or their class teachers so that we can support you. Please remember that everyone's experience of lockdown has been very different and to be kind to yourselves and each other.

Drop off and collection timing arrangements remain the same. Please continue to be prompt but only enter the school gate at your child's allocated timings. We ask parents to continue to wear masks on the school site and to socially distance from each other and staff at all times. We haven't had any cases at school to date, however I really need you to support us to ensure that this success continues.

We are remaining in year group bubbles and have kept routines the same as when the children were last all in school. This will hopefully help them settle back into a familiar routine quickly. The expectation is that children return in full uniform, however I realise that growth spurts and the continued closure of shops may make this a challenge for parents. Please just do what you can...it is more important that the children are back in school with us!

Please book your child's lunches for 3 weeks in advance to ensure the kitchen can plan catering numbers. We have had a few issues of children not liking what parents have chosen for them so if possible do this with your child and remind them what they are having in the mornings so they aren't surprised by their choices. Please ensure you have booked lunches for up to the Easter holidays and then after that it will be on a 3 weekly cycle in line with the school 3 week menu.

If you are using our Woodlands breakfast and after school club well in advance to help us to plan for staffing. Children remain in their year group bubbles within the club and we ask parents to ring the club mobile when you arrive for collection and wear masks at the front door.

Included in this newsletter are a list of events for this half term. Unfortunately, guidance still doesn't allow for audiences in school but I am hoping that this will change in the summer term allowing for some events to take place. I will of course keep you informed.
