## Home Learning Activities

Topic: Traditional Tales - Goldilocks and the Three Bears



### Personal, Social, Emotional/ Communication & Language/Literacy

Share lots of Rhymes, Songs and Stories.

Traditional Tales:

'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' (Tapestry)

Read the story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and talk about the characters and setting. Join in with the repeated and rhyming phrases - "This porridge/chair etc is too hot/hard etc!" - "Who's been eating my porridge/sitting on my chair etc".....Try using lots of expression in your voice. Do some role play of the story.

Sequence the pictures to tell the story (Tapestry)

Sing the 'n', 'i', 'p' songs (Tapestry) and practise forming them with your finger/pencil/pen.



### Number/Maths

Number rhymes, songs and stories:

Five Little Ducks, When Goldilocks went to the house of the bears...(Tapestry), Five little men in a Flying saucer (You Tube)

Can you find 3 different sized bowls, spoons, cups, chairs and bears and make a house. Maybe you could have a picnic with little, middle sized and big sandwiches, cakes or biscuits.

Order the bowls etc from biggest/largest to smallest, use the vocabulary of size - little, small, big, large, smallest, biggest, smaller /bigger than etc

Can you draw a huge number 3 and collect 3 stones, 3 beads, 3 coins, 3 pasta shapes etc.



### Expressive Art & Design/ Physical Development

Make a bear mask from a paper plate (Tapestry).

Ask a grown up to help you make some porridge. Follow the instructions and measure/weigh out the oats and milk/water. Can you mix it using a wooden spoon? Try your porridge with different toppings on - sugar, crunchy muesli, sprinkles, syrup, chocolate sauce, crunchy rice crispies...

Put some porridge oats in a bowl or tray. Put in 3 different sized bowls/yogurt pots etc, 3 different sized spoons, cardboard tubes, pots with screw lids etc and enjoy the oats!



### Understanding the World

Ask a grown up to help you to find out about real bears. Look in some books, print some pictures and cut them out. Find out where bears live (Google 'youtube bears preschool' for some videos)

Draw or stick photos of your family ordering them from the biggest (tallest) to smallest (shortest) person or the smallest to the biggest. Maybe you could write the numbers under them to show how many people there are in your family, maybe you could write some letters from their name on it. You could draw them in a big house with a roof, chimney etc.
