Topic: Traditional Tales - The Three Little Pigs w/c 1.3.21



Personal, Social, Emotional/ Communication & Language/Literacy

Share lots of Rhymes, Songs and Stories.

Traditional Tales;

'The Three Little Pigs' (Tapestry)

Read the story 'The Three Little Pigs' and talk about the characters and setting. Join in with the repeated and rhyming phrases - "Little pig, little pig let me in!" - "No, not by the hair on my chinny, chin, chin I will not let you " etc Try using lots of expression in your voice. Do some role play of the story.

Make some masks using paper plates and act out the story or make puppets and do a puppet show.



Expressive Art & Design/ Physical Development

Find some sticks in your garden or on a walk and tie some straw or leaves on the end to make some paint brushes. Ask for some old bricks or find some big stones. Use your brushes to paint (or use water), the bricks/stones.

Can you build 3 houses in your garden or in the woods for the 3 pigs? You could use sticks, stones, branches..... Draw and cut out, or use dough to make 3 pigs to live in your houses. Could you make the big, bad wolf?!



Number/Maths

Number rhymes, songs and stories

Find 3 sticks - a long one, a middle sized one and a short one. What can you find that is the same length as your sticks, longer than your sticks and shorter than your sticks?

Play the 'Pig Races' game. Using a die and some pigs/counters race to see who can get to their house first! You could make the board longer, with more squares and use 2 dice for higher numbers. Good Luck! (Tapestry)



Understanding the World

On a tray make a small world scene - collect some stones, twigs, sticks etc and make some houses, paths.....If you have animals use them or maybe cut some out, make some puppets and create the story setting.

Use your story setting to do a 'show' and tell the story to your family using your tray scene.

Find out something about pigs.....what colours can they be/what is a baby pig called/what are pigs feet called/what do pigs live in/what do farmers give to pigs to eat.....?
