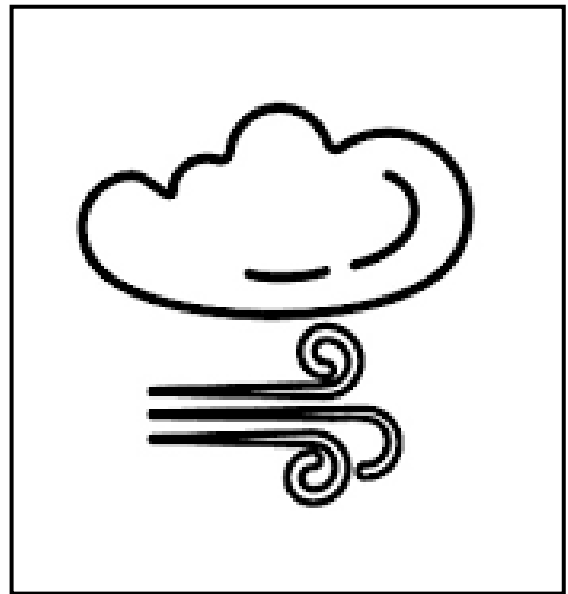
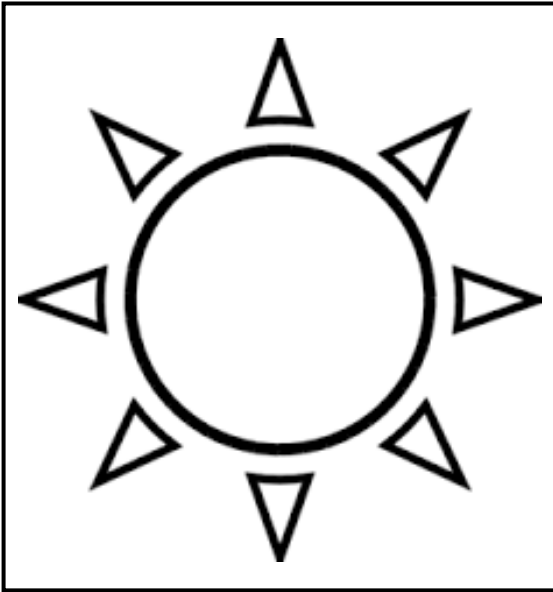
DAY	DAILY ACTIVITIES
Monday Incy Wincy Spider 	<p>Welcome: Miss Hardy-Trodd will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Watch Miss Randles' video on Tapestry introducing today's digraph "oo oo."</p> <p>Maths: Explore how many different ways you can make 8 e.g. $7+1=8$, $2+6=8$.</p> <p>Literacy: Watch the weather together or explore your local weather on the BBC website (link below) and talk about the different weathers and the symbols which represent them and complete the activity below.</p> <p>Circle Time: Talk about the term 'Perseverance' at home. Incy Wincy persevered and kept climbing the waterspout, even though he kept falling down. Draw a picture of something you are persevering to master at the moment... <i>I am persevering to write my name, I am persevering to learn to ride a bike etc.</i> Listen to the Perseverance song (link below)</p> <p>Topic: Use or make your own playdough to create your own spider - method for making playdough below.</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with Miss Randles</p>
Tuesday Row, Row, Row Your Boat 	<p>Welcome: Miss Randles will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Watch 'Mr Thorne Does Phonics' introducing the new digraph "oi" (link below) and have a go at recording the following words: <i>coin, join, soil, oink</i> or extend with sentences e.g. The coin was in the soil.</p> <p>Maths: Explore capacity by filling a container (cup/jug etc) following simple instructions – "fill up your container until it is full/half full/empty".</p> <p>Literacy: Imagine you have '<i>rowed your boat, gently down the stream</i>', where would you end up? Have a go at creating your own land... you may want to add labels too.</p> <p>Topic: Watch Miss Hardy-Trodd's video on Tapestry, exploring floating and sinking.</p> <p>Art: Design your own boat and see if it can float! Can it carry a toy?</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with Mrs Money</p>
Wednesday Humpty Dumpty 	<p>Welcome: Miss Hardy-Trodd will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Watch 'Mr Thorne Does Phonics' introducing the new digraph "ow" (link below) and have a go at recording the following words: <i>cow, now, owl, frown, clown, growl</i>. Remember to underline the ow digraph in each word.</p> <p>Maths: Collect eight objects from around your house and have a go at ordering them from 'lightest' to 'heaviest'.</p> <p>Literacy: Listen to and join in with Miss Randles' guided reading session on Tapestry.</p> <p>PE: Join in with Mrs Thomas' and Mrs Roberts' PE challenge on Tapestry.</p> <p>Topic: Have a go at creating your own puzzle. Using the template below, draw a picture and ask an adult to help you cut out the puzzle pieces, then have a go at "<i>putting it back together again</i>".</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with Miss Randles</p>

<p>Thursday</p> <p>Twinkle Twinkle Little Star</p> 	<p>Welcome: Miss Randles will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry</p> <p>Phonics: Watch 'Mr Thorne Does Phonics' introducing the new digraph "or" (link below) and have a go at recording the following words: <i>horn, storm, fork, sport, torch</i>. Remember to underline the or digraph in each word.</p> <p>Maths: Using the template below, cut out the triangles and see if you can carefully place them together to create your own star shape. Can you decorate your star to make it shine?</p> <p>Literacy: Listen to the story of 'How to catch a star' (link below)</p> <p>Science: Create your own rocket (ideas below).</p> <p>Topic: Have a go at making 'star' biscuits with a grown up, can you take step by step photos? (Ingredients below).</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with Miss Hardy-Trodd</p>
<p>Friday</p>	<p>Welcome: Miss Hardy-Trodd will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry</p> <p>Phonics: Watch Miss Hardy-Trodd's video for our phonics recap.</p> <p>Maths: Play the 'Shapes Patterns' game online and see if you can repeat the patterns (link below).</p> <p>Literacy: Recap the concept of rhyming and discuss how the nursery rhymes throughout the week have rhymed e.g. "Incy, Wincy", "Humpty, Dumpty". See if you can create two of your own rhyming sentences. We would love to see these so if you'd like to, have a go at writing them down or maybe you could make a video to share them to us.</p> <p>Music: Chose your favourite nursery rhyme of the week and have a go at taping/clapping/humming out the rhythm and ask your grown up to sing the rhyme.</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with Mr Seddon</p>

Playdough

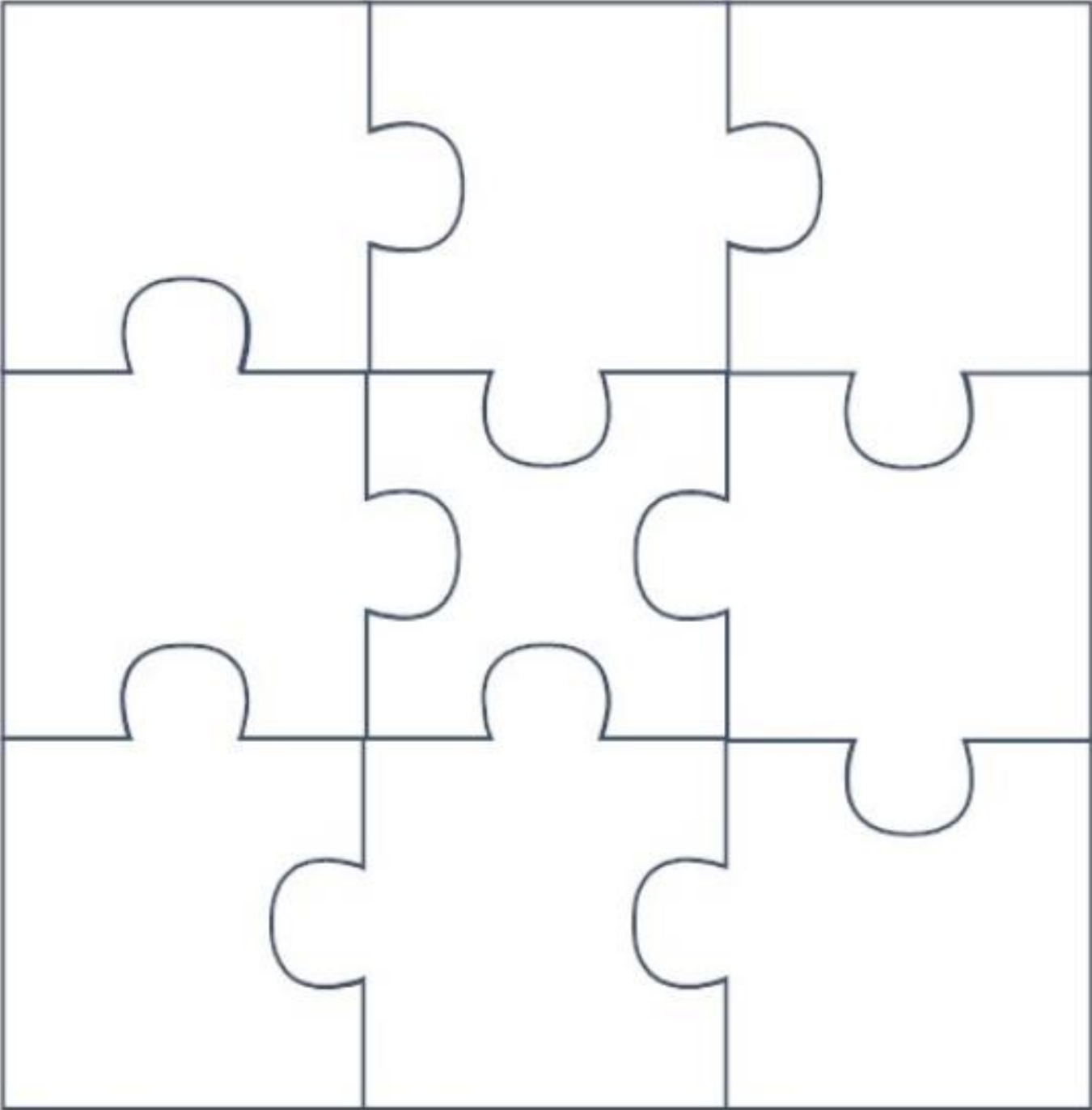
Ingredients

- 3 Cups of flour
- 1/3 cup of salt
- 2 tbsp vegetable oil
- 1 cup of water
- Large mixing bowl
- Paint (optional)

Method

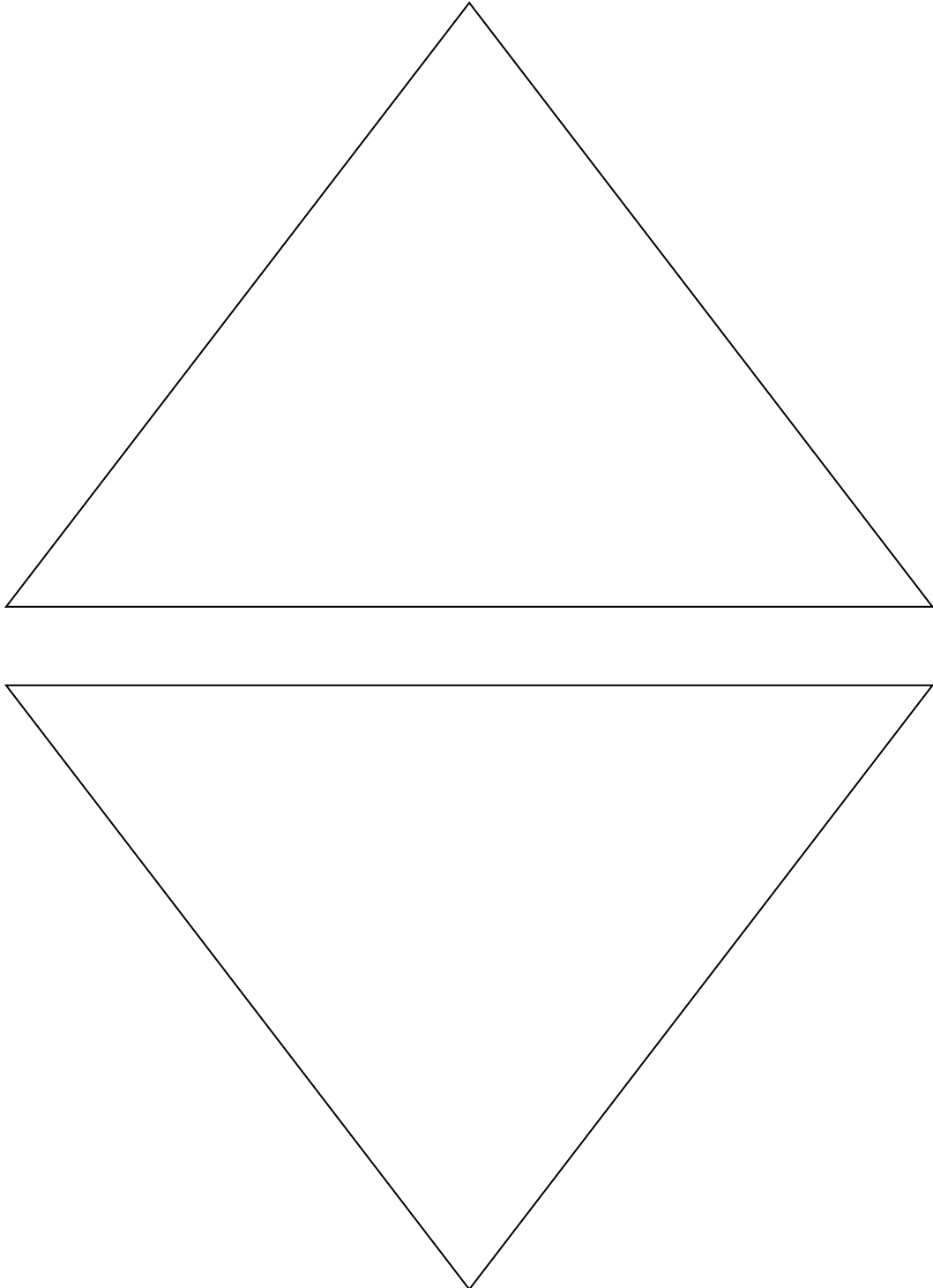
1. Mix flour, salt and vegetable oil in a large bowl.
2. Add water and paint.
3. Knead the dough until desired consistency.

Star Biscuits

Ingredients

- 100g butter
- 50g caster sugar
- 175g plain flour
- A few drops of vanilla extract

Equipment

- Bowl
- Spoon
- Rolling pin
- Star cookie cutter
- Baking tray

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 150°C.
2. Add butter and sugar in a bowl and mix well until light and fluffy.
3. Add the vanilla, mix, then add the flour and mix well.
4. Roll out to about 5mm thick. Cut into star shapes.
5. Bake for 25 minutes or until golden brown.
