Topic Theme: Fruit



Described below are some suggested activities for home learning that we hope will structure you and your child's day. The activities are related to our topic and reflect what we would be learning about at this point in the year in Reception. Please remember this structure must be flexible and accommodate your child's needs and interests – feel free to adapt it however you like and most importantly have fun and send us pictures of what you do! We know everyone has different circumstances at home and you need to make the home learning work for your family Remember each day to allocate time to play, for reading, physical activity etc. Remember to also include an act of kindness; tidy your toys, help lay the table, help unload the dishwasher, read a story to a younger sibling etc.

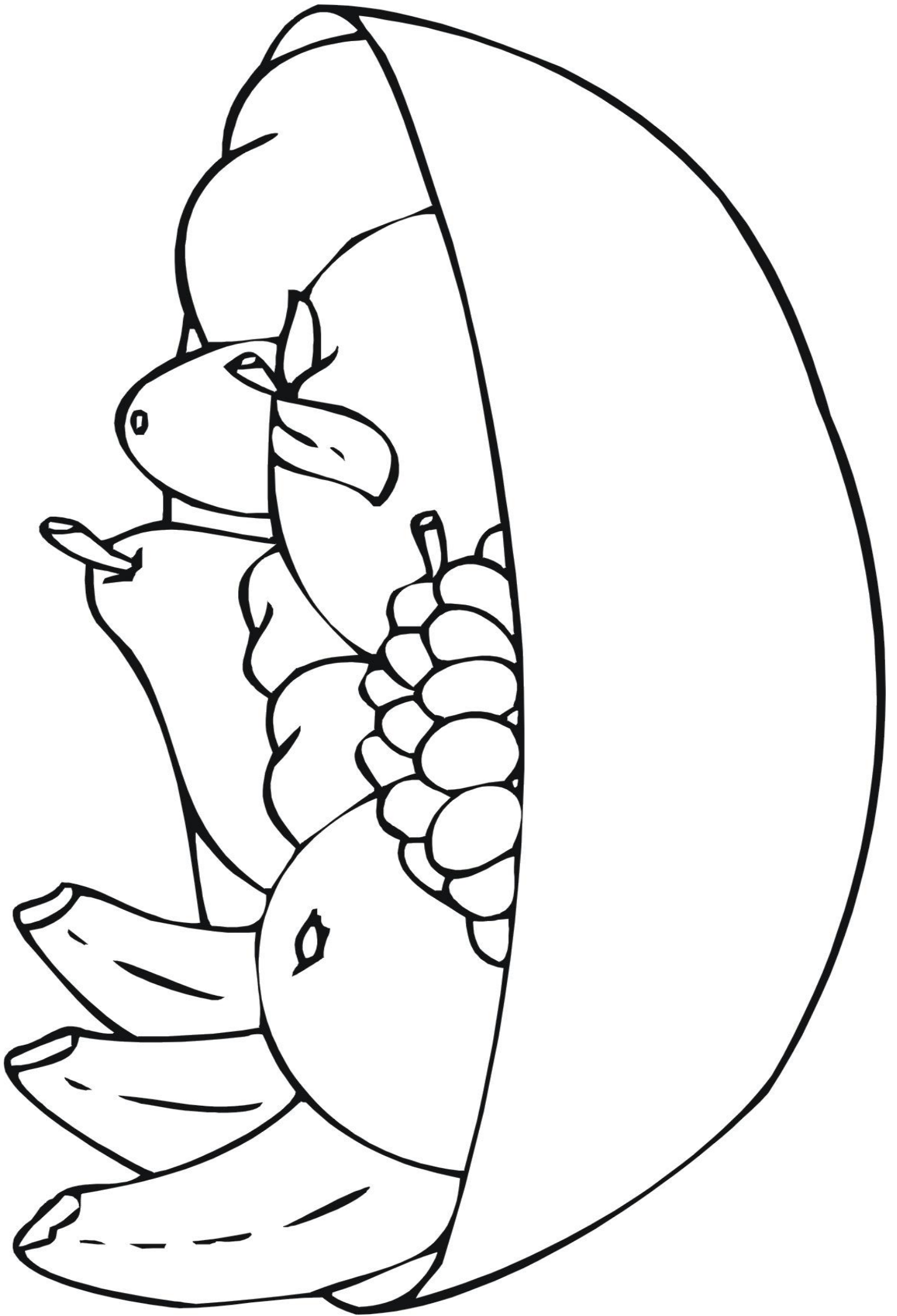

DAY	DAILY ACTIVITIES
Monday	<p>Welcome: Miss Hardy-Trodd will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Create your own 'My Turn, Your Turn' cards for all of the digraphs and have a go at playing this game with someone in your family - ch, sh, th/th, ng, qu, ck, ai, ee, oa, oo/oo, oi, ow, or ur, ar, ue.</p> <p>Literacy: Choose your favourite story book from home and have a go at seeing how many digraphs/tricky words you can spot.</p> <p>Maths: Watch the big number song (link below). Practise your counting. What is the biggest number you can count up to?</p> <p>Circle Time: Make a card for a friend or your teachers. Can you add a picture to the front and a little message inside? You may wish to post your card if you can get to a post box.</p> <p>Topic: Draw a picture of something you did in the half term break. Perhaps you went for a walk somewhere new? Learnt to play a new game? Watched something funny on television?</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with Miss Randles.</p>
Tuesday	<p>Welcome: Miss Randles will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Watch Miss Randles' video to explore the tricky words was and my.</p> <p>Maths: Collect different fruits and weigh them. Which fruit is the heaviest? Which fruit is the lightest? How can you tell? Record your findings in any way you like.</p> <p>Literacy: Listen to the story of 'Handa's Surprise' and use the story template (attached separately) to have a go at writing a sentence about the story. What was your favourite part? What happened at the beginning or the end? Remember to use your phonics to sound out each of your chosen words - words put together will make a sentence!</p> <p>Science: Watch Miss Hardy-Trodd's fruit experiment on Tapestry.</p> <p>Topic: Watch "Maddie's Do You Know" discussing composting and recycling. Talk with an adult about recycling and composting. Do you help at home? At school why does our leftover snack go in a food bin and other waste in a rubbish bin?</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with Miss Hardy-Trodd.</p>
Wednesday	<p>Welcome: Miss Hardy-Trodd will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Watch Miss Hardy-Trodd's video to explore the tricky words you and they.</p> <p>Maths: Watch Miss Randles' video explaining tally charts and then create your own.</p> <p>Literacy: Have a go at helping your grown-ups write a shopping list (template below).</p> <p>PE: Discuss with your grown-ups why Handa carries the fruit for Akeyo in a basket which she carefully balances on her head. Imagine you are carrying a big basket of fruit (cushion) and have a go at carefully balancing it on your head from one side of the room to the other. Can you think of different items to carefully balance? If you would like a challenge, have a go at balancing your 'basket' on your shoulder or elbow.</p>

	<p>Topic: Try different fruits, can you order them from your most to least favourite? Perhaps you could try a fruit you haven't tried before!</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with a 'Surprise Storyteller'.</p>
Thursday	<p>Welcome: Miss Randles will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Join us this afternoon for a LIVE game of Tricky Word Bingo (teams link via email).</p> <p>Maths: Watch the Number Jacks explain the concept of 'halving' (link below) and then have a go at halving different things you can find at home. Can you cut a piece of fruit in half? Can you break a Lego tower in half? Can you cut a piece of paper in half?</p> <p>Literacy: Listen to Mrs Sewrey read 'The Kitchen Disco' then use the fruit bowl template below to colour in your fruit... consider the colours carefully and try and use a different 'media' for each fruit. For example <i>a green <u>crayon</u> for the apple, a yellow <u>felt pen</u> for the banana, purple <u>collage pieces</u> for the grapes...</i></p> <p>Topic: After to listening to the story, have your own disco! Play party games such a 'Musical Statues' and remember it is okay if you don't win every time.</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with Miss Randles.</p>
Friday	<p>Welcome: Miss Hardy-Trodd will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Ask your grown-ups to read out the tricky words and have a go at writing them on your own - to, go, no, he, she, the, me, we, was, my. How many can you spell correctly? NB: Please only focus on the first 5 if your child finds this tricky! Children are likely to spell these words phonetically (i.e. w-o-z = was) at first. Praise their efforts and model the correct spelling afterwards if you feel they are ready.</p> <p>Maths: Play the game 'Fruit Splat' (link below) and see if you can beat your score each time.</p> <p>Literacy: Make your own fruit smoothie (BBC Good Food have lots of great recipe ideas if needed). Give your smoothie a name and write down a list of the ingredients needed to make it. If you would like a challenge, have a go at writing down instructions to explain how to make your smoothie.</p> <p>Music: Listen to the 'Handa's surprise' song to finish off the week! (link below).</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time with Mr Seddon.</p>
