VE day on Friday 8th May commemorates 75 years since the end of the Second World War. Despite being in lockdown for this special event you may still want to celebrate with your family. Please find below a list of fun activities which you may like to choose from to help with your celebrations.

- Plan an indoor picnic or garden party and make union jack bunting and flags
- Play traditional party games, ball games, board games and hopscotch
- Make a hat to wear for your party, dress up as royalty and sing/listen to wartime songs
- Make paper aeroplanes or spitfire gliders and have a family competition to see whose plane flies the furthest
- Find out about the morse code and write a message to someone in the family. You could use a spoon and pan to 'send' the message!
- Create a ration meal - cottage pie, crumble, eggless sponge.
- Bake some fairy cakes or a Victoria sponge cake. Enjoy some cucumber sandwiches and try a cup of tea!
- Create a commemorative garden - use a shoe box lid, tray or cut down box. Add stones and gravel for a path, twigs, and a memorial stone and create the letters VE in flowers
- Listen to the Queens special address at 9am. This is the same time that her Father King George VI spoke to the UK 75 years ago on the actual VE day
