Knowledge As Historians

We will learn how the Great Fire of London started, the events that followed and the impact the fire had on how London was rebuilt. We will use the first-hand account of Samuel Pepys and look at some of his diary entries. We will also discuss the actions of Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate on the 5th

As Geographer

November each year

We will also explore the cold continent of Antarctica and learn the seven continents of the world and the 5 oceans.

As Scientists

We will investigate the suitability of a range of everyday materials for specific uses and how the shape of some materials can be changed through heat, cold, squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. Some of these changes will be irreversible. As part of our topic on materials we will also look at the differences between man-made and natural materials

As Technologists

We will learn about moving forwards, backwards, making half and quarter turns and how we can use algorithms to programme something by using a set of instructions.

As Musicians

We will learn about dynamics (loudness or volume) and timbre (difference in sound between notes) through learning how to add expression to our singing. We will also learn how to use instruments to create different sounds and the different family's instruments come from.

As a Young Person (PSHE/RE)

We will learn about celebrating differences and how sometimes girls and boys can be stereotyped. We will discuss why bullying happens and that sometimes it is about being different. We will learn how important it is to stand up for ourselves and for others an and that it is okay to be different. In RE we will learn about Diwali, Remembrance Day, churches and the Christmas story.

As a Multi Sports Athlete



We will experience different pathways when traveling using zig zag, straight and curved patterns. We will link different movements by making large, small, high and low movements using turns and jumps. In dance we will create short repetitive patterns to create simple dances.

As Artists and Design Technicians

We will learn about the properties and qualities of clay through a series of short, exploratory activities, before going on to design and make a tile based on our observations of buildings in the local environment.
