

Welcome Newsletter - Year Two

September 2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to Year Two. We hope that you and your children have enjoyed the first few days in their new classes. We like to contact you early in the term to confirm some details about your child's transition, classroom organisation and home-school liaison.

Coming into School in the Morning

Due to the continuing COVID 19 guidelines on visitors/adults in school your child will now come into school via the green gates through the car park. Once you have brought them up to the gates you will be met by some of the Year Two staff. Then they will then walk to their classroom and independently put their coat, book bag and water bottle away. They are also responsible for handing any letters or correspondence from home to their class teacher. Please remind them to take these out of their book bags. We will also reinforce this in class.

As there are not the same daily opportunities to speak to the teacher can you please contact the office with any changes to pick up at the end of the day.

Book Bags

Due to Covid-19 measures we need to limit the number of items in the cloakroom and so we will require the children to keep their book bags in their trays. To enable these to fit we ask that any key-rings are removed and their book bag is named and only contains their reading folder.

Uniform

Please ensure your child comes to school in the correct uniform every day. This includes shoes and accessories. Long hair for both boys and girls should be tied back for school. Hair accessories must also be in school colours and we would ask that the recent craze for large fashion bows are not worn to school. If your child has pierced ears, then you need to have signed a disclosure form to allow the earrings to be worn in school each day. This form is available from the school office.

PE Kit

Our PE days are Monday afternoons and Wednesday mornings. Please ensure that your child has the correct PE kit in school at the beginning of each half term. It will be sent home to be washed each school holiday. We will be doing outdoor PE throughout the year so please ensure your child has suitable plimsolls or trainers that fit correctly. We go out in all weathers, so school tracksuit bottoms are useful as well as socks if your child wears tights. If your child has long hair, please ensure that it is tied back. Please ensure that earrings are removed on PE days before your child comes to school. If the earrings cannot be removed then they need to be taped up and you will need to sign a disclosure form as above. These are County Health and Safety requirements.

School Caps

Named school caps should be in school every day and kept in your child's tray or book bag. They will need to wear them for any visits out of school (Covid dependent) and when the weather is hot.

School Dinners

Your child will still have the same choice of healthy menu that they enjoyed last year. If your child has a packed lunch, please remember that we are a nut free school as we have several children and staff members with severe allergies. Please also remember to cut grapes in half lengthways. The menu will be posted on the school website and school meals now need to be ordered online.

Fruit and Milk

The children will be able to enjoy a piece of fruit each day at morning play time. If you would like your child to have milk, it is available to order through 'Cool Milk' online. Links to 'Cool Milk' are on the school website or directly via www.coolmilk.com

Water Bottles

Please can you provide your child with a **clearly named** sports water bottle **filled only with water** to keep their brains hydrated and active for learning. Children can refill their water bottle in school. We encourage the children to take responsibility to drink regularly and to refill their water bottle when required.

Money

We are now a cashless school. Any money that needs to come into school should be paid online through the school cash office. Links to the school cash office can be found on the school website. Please see Mrs Cable in the school office if you have any queries regarding this.

Celebrating Achievements

Unfortunately, we are unable to welcome and celebrate children's achievements, certificates, trophies and medals from out of school activities as we previously did in our Celebration Assembly. However, during our weekly class circle time any child who has something to share will be encouraged to do so with the class.

Birthdays

We celebrate birthdays in school by singing to the children and they get opportunity to choose a birthday card from their classmates. Regrettably, due to a number of allergies within the school, children are not allowed to bring in sweets or cakes to share with their friends - please save these for parties!

Reading Books

Reading books should come into school and go home each evening. Your help with reading at home is invaluable. Please record in their reading diary; the title, the date and the page that they have read to. We also welcome your comments. Your child will read once a week to either a teacher or a Learning Support Assistant. Due to the fact that you are unable to come in and change your child's books we will be sending home extra books when we hear your child read. Please make sure that they are all kept in their bookbag. In order to move to the next stage, your child will need to be assessed by a member of the teaching staff against the reading assessment criteria. The teacher will make this decision; please be aware that if they move too quickly through the scheme and have not met their targets, they may need to re-read books again.

Assessment

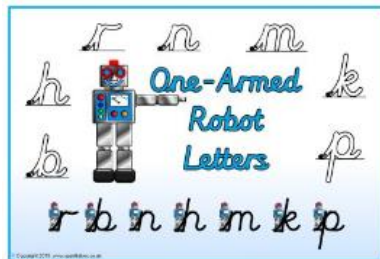
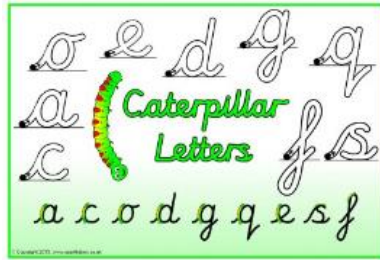
In Year Two the children are assessed each half term against National Curriculum goals using an assessment system called 'Assertive Mentoring'. Each child has their own folder, which will be shared during Parents Evening. Judgements against the criteria are made through teacher assessment as well as evidence collected in your child's books. There is also a National Phonics Screening Test, which the children will take in the 2nd half of the Autumn term (due to COVID 19 this did not happen at the end of Year One). If they did not achieve the required score your child will re-sit the screening again in the Summer term of Year Two. At The end of Year Two the children will sit their Standard Assessment Tests. An information evening regarding this will be held later in the year.

Phonics and Spellings

There is a strong emphasis on reading and spelling. Children have a daily phonics session to support this. Each session has a reading and a spelling element. The children will also have spelling lists sent home every 2 weeks. The spellings will be made up of the Year Two common exception words that they will need to be able to read and spell by the end of the academic year. Your support with this would be appreciated; we would ask that you practice these with your child over the year. These will be sent home during the first few weeks.

Handwriting

All children are taught to write using a cursive handwriting style. These are letters that have "lead ins and lead outs". This style of letter formation supports a much smoother transition to joined handwriting. Part of the end of year assessment process for Year Two includes being able to form capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another and to lower-case letters. The children need to also show that they can use spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters. Once a child has successfully and consistently shown they are able to do this they will get a handwriting certificate, badge and special handwriting pencil from Mrs Money. NB: As long as they meet the above criteria they do not need to show that they can join their writing unless they are at this stage in the writing process.



Home Learning

Your child will receive a number of activities as part of their home learning:

- Reading books
- Spellings sent home every 2 weeks
- An 'Invitation to Learning' book sent home every half term, with half a term to complete the activities.
- Athletics - The children will have access to Athletics and their log in will be the same. Logins will be sent home but please contact us if you haven't already received it.
- You will receive an information leaflet about websites and games that will help with maths.

Important Dates

Further dates and school events will continue to be communicated with parents in a fortnightly newsletter from Mrs Money, emailed via schoolcomms, as well as being available on the school website.
