Year I Phonics and Reading


- Daily Phonics lessons ELS Phonics programme
- Review sounds, orally blend sounds, focus on word recognition and meaning
- Children are heard read aloud every day during the Phonics lesson, applying the new sounds they have been taught
- Every Friday, they will bring home a book which is entirely decodable and based on Phonics teaching in class or your child's sound knowledge
- Group reads each week with a teacher or LSA
- Phonics Screening Check in June





How can I help my child?

- Arrive on time for school Phonics begins at 9am
- ► Listen to your child read every day at least 4 times to secure new vocab/sounds
- Practise the letter sounds and the harder to read and spell words they are learning in class that week (these are the tricky words that cannot be decoded using sounds)
