Year R Phonics and Reading

- Daily Phonics lessons ELS Phonics programme
- Teach sounds, orally blend sounds, focus on word recognition and meaning
- Children read aloud every day during the Phonics lesson, applying the new sounds they have been taught
- Every Friday, they will bring home a book which is entirely decodable and based on Phonics teaching in class or your child's sound knowledge
- The book shared in class during the week can be accessed through the ELS e-library for you to share at home
- Small group reads or I:I with teacher every other week








Reading for Pleasure

Physical Development

Year R PE days are on Tuesdays with TS Coaching

Please ensure that the children come to school in their PE kit on the correct day as we have very limited spares in school

Outdoor learning— classes alternate each week

Uniform and Equipment Needed

- Book bags need to come to school every day
- Correct PE kit with trainers on PE days
- Coat with a hood

- Order school hot lunches on SCOPAY before coming to school - encourage your children to develop independence, look at the menu with you and remember their lunch choice (red, green or yellow)

How can I help my child?

- Arrive on time for school Phonics begins at 9am
- Fine motor skills and name writing
- Listen to your child read every day
- Practise the letter sounds and the harder to read and spell words they are learning in class that week (these are the tricky words that cannot be decoded using sounds)
